Burglary charges include anything from breaking and entering to car theft. If you have been convicted of a burglary charge, you are almost certainly going to be tried as a convicted felon. If you entered a building or property, even if it is done lawfully, and stayed longer than invited while intending to commit a crime, you can be charged with burglary.

You could be facing a minimum of one year in state prison along with fines and other penalties associated with burglary. It is of the utmost importance to find a criminal defense attorney to fight for you in these trying times. There are different levels of burglary in Washington and a Seattle criminal defense lawyer can provide you with representation if you are charged with any of the following types of burglary:

- **First Degree Burglary:** If burglary is committed and the perpetrator is either armed with a weapon or uses a weapon and assaults another person, they may be charged. Class A Felony.
- **Second Degree Burglary:** If burglary is committed by illegally entering or remaining in a building other than a residence, the person may be charged with second degree burglary. Class B Felony.
- **Residential Burglary:** If burglary is committed by illegally entering or remaining in a person's home or residence, including mobile homes and travel trailers, they may be charged. Class B Felony.
